It takes the whole world to know Christ

Do you think a fish knows that it's swimming in water? I've been reflecting on this question not because it's some kind of Buddhist koan – the type of question that asks, 'What's the sound of one hand clapping?' Rather it's because I've been reflecting recently on questions of culture and world view. Do I see the world purely from the perspective of being who I am? (A 55-year-old white Englishman who grew up in a small village in the 1970s.) If that's the case, is what I see an accurate representation of the whole of reality? Might other perspectives be possible? If I could see the world through the eyes of others, might my vision be richer, wider, deeper? Like a fish that suddenly realizes that seeing can happen not only through water, but through air as well?

Seeing things from the perspective of others was something that Jesus did. An example

of this happens when Jesus heals a centurion's servant in Luke's Gospel (Luke 7: 1-10). The centurion comes from a background and culture that's entirely different to that in which Jesus grew up. Yet Jesus is blown away by the insight that the centurion has about who Jesus himself is. This leads Jesus to exclaim 'I tell you, not even in Israel have I found such faith!'

The Diocese of Bath and Wells has a link with the five Anglican Dioceses of Zambia. There's much to be celebrated in the friendship that we share: the joy and vitality of the Zambian Church, the opportunities our link offers to help some of the world's poorest communities. But for me, the greatest gift we gain is the opportunity our link offers to stand in the shoes of others and to see the world, our faith, and the whole of reality from a different perspective.

A wise person once said to me 'It takes the whole world to know Christ'. Our link with Zambia enables us to see more of the Jesus we share than we could ever hope to experience otherwise.

Pause for Thought

"The word of God is living and active." *

It is alive and effective. It changes things.

The writer is writing to convince his readers that Jesus is better than anything that went before:

better than the prophets, Moses, the O.T. priesthood and the O.T. Covenant and sacrifices. The whole letter speaks of the universal supremacy of Jesus.

So, we can pretty safely assume that he is talking about Jesus when he says, 'the Word of God'. Jesus **is** God's expression of Himself in human form.

Jesus **is** alive and changes things. He changes us. To do that, he is able to penetrate deep, deep inside us, like the 'two-edged sword' the writer speaks of....to the very core of our being....to the core of what we really are....living beings, animated by God's life-giving spirit.

We find our thoughts and our attitudes judged (as others did) by, for example, Jesus' presence with them and his parables.

'Thoughts and attitudes', the writer says....so not actions?

Is this not how Jesus brings about change in us? In the light of His presence, we become aware of our need for inner change. It is God who works in us, both to will and to do that which pleases him. I suppose the real pause for thought is how responsive are we?






